

"On the 7th of Maich local MP Vicki Ward hosted the annual International Women's Day Celebration that hosts the Pauline Toner Prize.

A number of speeches were delivered by Vicki Ward, Federal Member for Jagajaga Kate Thwaites, and guest speaker Melanie Kwee who has been "breaking the bias" in the construction industry, and currently holds a directorial role at Major Road Projects Victoria.

The Pauline Toner Prize was named after Pauline due to her inspiring time in politics. She was not only the first woman to be elected to the Victorian Legislative Assembly in our area but also the first Victorian female Minister.

Our two student nominees for the Pauline Toner Prize joined seven other young women from surrounding high schools.

Cassie Tibbits was nominated due to her commitment to our school value of 'Social and Environmental Responsibility', which she showed through her work in the Do It In A Dress Campaign and volunteer work at Scouts Victoria.

Shahla Paynter was the other nominee from our school, and winner of the prize, as a result of her hard work in including more women in jazz (including starting the female jazz ensemble). She has been a part of Harmony Team for several years, supporting people in the LGBTQIA+ community and running the Do It In A Dress Campaign. Shahla's amazing work throughout the years won her this Prize, and all of us here at school could not be prouder of the astonishing work our students do. Great job Cassie and I congratulate all nominees from the various schools for the amazing work they are all doing within their school and amongst our community. I encourage them all to forge on with this work as I am certain that it will make a difference.

Where families have not used Compass in the past they will be encouraged to allow time before the commencement of the interviews to check their connection. Students in years 8-12 will be familiar with Webex having used it in 2021 for remote learning.

Elective Fees

Your payment towards Elective Subject Contributions allows the school to enrich our student's learning experience by providing materials above the minimum standard funded by the DET for these subject.

2022 CSEF Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- · School camps or trips
- Swimming and school-organised sport programs
- Outdoor education programs
- · Excursions and incursions

Applications for 2022 are now open, through until the end of term 2, 2022. If you applied for CSEF at Eltham High School in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. Eltham High School will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2022 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply at the same school in 2021 or
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Schools are able to accept and process applications up until the end of term two each year. CSEF payments are made to schools from March onwards each year.

Oxfam Trailwalk 2022

100km at a Snail's Pace or 20 hours for the Galloping Gastropods?

For the tenth consecutive year (let's pretend 2020 & 2021 didn't happen) Eltham High School will be supporting a team in the Oxfam Trailwalk on 4 2 & 2 . The Trailwalk is a 100km fundraising event in which all four team members walk the whole 100km. Whilst participants (about 750 teams) have 48 hours to complete the distance, our Eltham High School team are aiming for an ambitious time of 20 hours or less. Training for this target is progressing well, with recent training sessions up around the 50 km mark.

The 2022 team consists of Cameron Laurence, Peter Seymour and Ross McKinnon. The Trailwalk is Oxfam's biggest fundraiser, with the 2022 Victorian Trailwalk aiming to raise over two and a half million dollars to support Oxfam's work both nationally and internationally. Payment of the Music Fees can be made by completing and returning the credit card details on the Credit Card Payment Form emailed to you on 25 February 2022 or by cash, BPay, credit card (over the phone by calling 9430 5118) or by cheque made payable to "Eltham High School". We previously advised that the instrumental music fees would be added to Compass, unfortunately there has been a change to this policy and they will not be added to Compass. The music fees will appear on your family statement, not in the Compass Parent Portal.
